New Repeater

The new Yaesu DR-1X Digital/FM repeater is now in operation. It is a privately owned repeater, and is open for use by any ham. The frequency is 449.440, with a negative offset of 5 MHz (444.440), and the CTCSS is 131.8. The repeater identifies in Morse code only, and there are no voice announcements.

You do not need a new radio to use it, unless you want to utilize its digital features. Yaesu radios that are capable of digital voice are the FT1-DR and FT2-DR handhelds, the FTM-400DM mobile, and FT-991 all-mode HF/VHF/UHF transceiver. The repeater automatically detects whether you are using standard FM or C4FM (Yaesu) digital voice mode. If you listen to the frequency and hear a buzzing sound, that is digital communications, and it means the repeater is busy. If the frequency is quiet, feel free to key up, identify, and see if anyone is around.

Many thanks to Chris WB6CDF for putting up the antenna, obtaining a frequency pair for the repeater, and tuning the duplexers. Also thanks to Sandy Samuels of the Hi Desert Repeater Network for loaning us the frequency, which is an inactive frequency assigned to their organization.
